It was in September, 1944, when ninetyone freshmen entered Sussex High School. We
finally organized and called our first class
meeting. We elected the following officers:
president Albert Rome for the first semester
and Lois Hardin, the second semester; vicepresident, Theodore Paugh; secretary, Janet
Breen; treasurer, Gerald Elston; adviser,
Mr. Fries.

We were soon taken into custody by the seniors and were initiated. It was a hilarious day with ninety-one freshmen running around in conspicuous styles. All of us survived initiation and had a grand time at the party which followed. We were then considered full fledged members of Sussex High School. In April, we had an amateur show which started our class fund.

In our sophomore year we elected the following officers: president, Dolson Ayers; vice-president, Paul Andrade; secretary, Clara House; treasurer, Anne Clouse; adviser, Miss Breznik. We presented two plays, "Grandmother Nick" and "Leave it to Joe", under the direction of Miss Hummer. These helped to increase our class fund.

We were finally recognized upper classmen in our junior year. At our first meeting we elected the following officers: president, Dolson Ayers; vice-president, Joe Deuchler; secretary, Clara House; treasurer, Anne Clouse; adviser, Mr. Cobb. One of our big moments in the junior year was the receiving of our class rings. We were very proud of them and everyone was greatly satisfied. In the junior year in order to raise class funds we sold Christmas cards. In the spring under the direction of Miss Nicholson, we presented our junior play, "How's Your Hokumbedo," which was a big success and enjoyed by all. Our junior prom was held in May and was well attended.

Finally in September, 1947, fifty-five of us were seen going to Sussex High School as seniors, proud, independent, seniors. Mr. Flood called us together to elect officers and an adviser. We elected the following: president, Bob Wright; vice-president, Dick Wood; secretary, Clara House; treasurer, Lois Hardin; Mr. Hey consented to be our class adviser. We chose the red rose as our class flower, blue and white our class colors, and "Forward to Success", our class motto.

During September we held our annual magazine campaign which ended with a total of \$3009.30.

On November 21 and 22 we presented our senior play, "Me and My Shadow," with the kind and patient help of Mrs. Jones. The play provided lots of laughs for the cast and the audience, as well as providing a considerable sum for our class treasury. In December it was decided to publish the second year book of Sussex High School. We were very grateful to Miss Robbins and Mr. Hey for their time and effort in helping us to publish our year book.

In our senior year we had four roller skating parties which were great fun and a help to our class treasury. We also had a round and square dance in March. The seniors held their annual prom February 13. It was a Valentine and Leap Year dance. A fine crowd was there and it was enjoyed by many.

Yes, the date finally arrived, April and our class trip to Washington, D. C. It was a wonderful trip that words couldn't describe.

By hard work we have reached our goal—graduation. We seniors, looking back over the past years, think of the wonderful times our class enjoyed and realize that these happy memories in Sussex High will always be with us.


system of instruments, we have been able to increase the number of our players.


The Stardusters have taken part in many of the musical activities of the high school and the community for the past four and a half years.




Future Farmers Of America

The Junior Varsity basketball team won 17 of its 18 games.


As a whole the boys did exceptionally well under the tutelage of Coach Charles Pursell. With the exception of one player the team will remain intact for the season of 1949.


