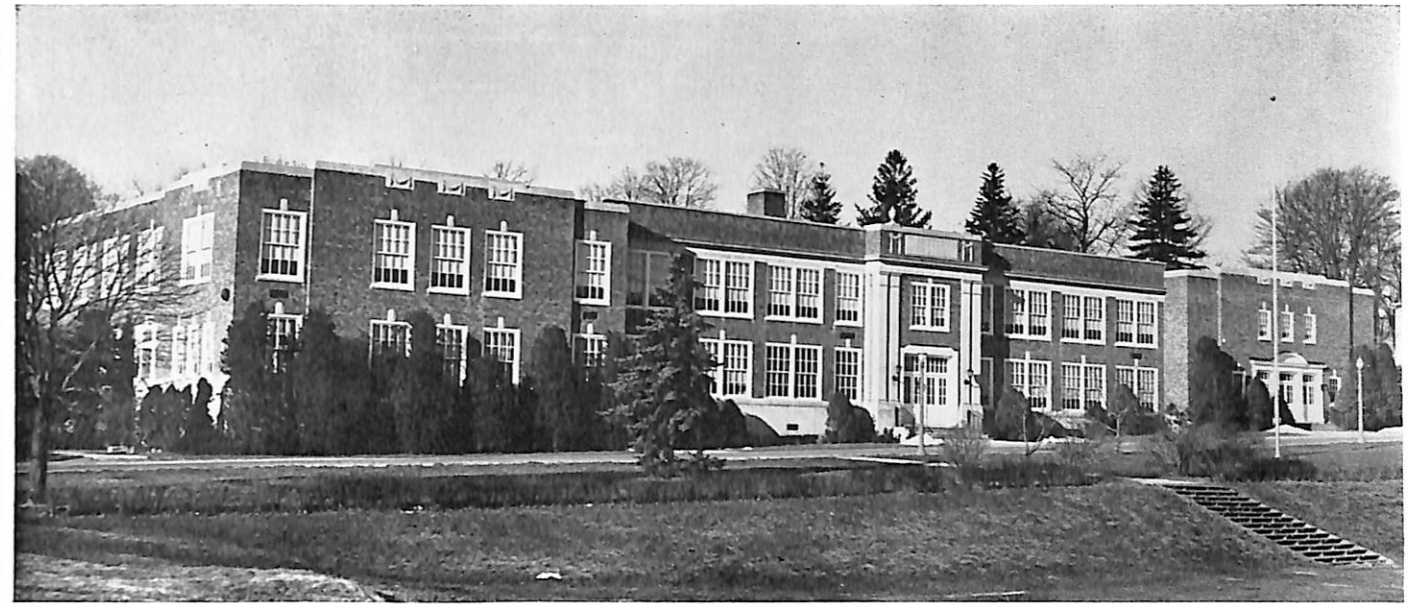

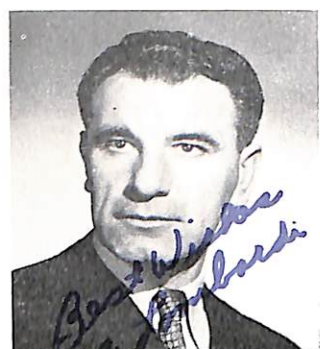

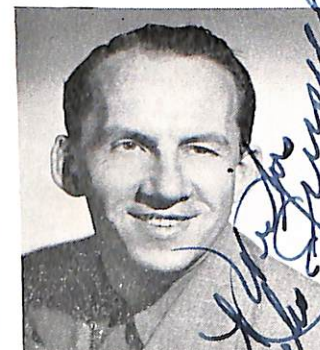

A grand cast gave a great performance of our senior play, *Professor, How Could You!* Everyone enjoyed it. At one of our class meetings, we suggested to have round and square dances after league basketball games, in order to raise funds. This proved to be successful.

On the 24th day of May 1950, we seniors started on our trip to Washington where we stayed at the New Colonial Hotel. Our trip included a very interesting trip through Virginia to Charlottesville to see Monticello, the home of Jefferson. Our trip to Washington, D. C., is one which all of us will remember for the rest of our lives.

On December 2, 1949, we held a Hobo Dance in the gym. The affair was a financial and social success.

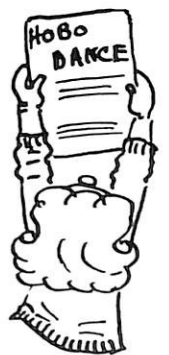
On January 31, 1950, the sophomore play, "Background for Nancy", directed by Mrs. Crabb, was presented before the student body. It was very favorably received.

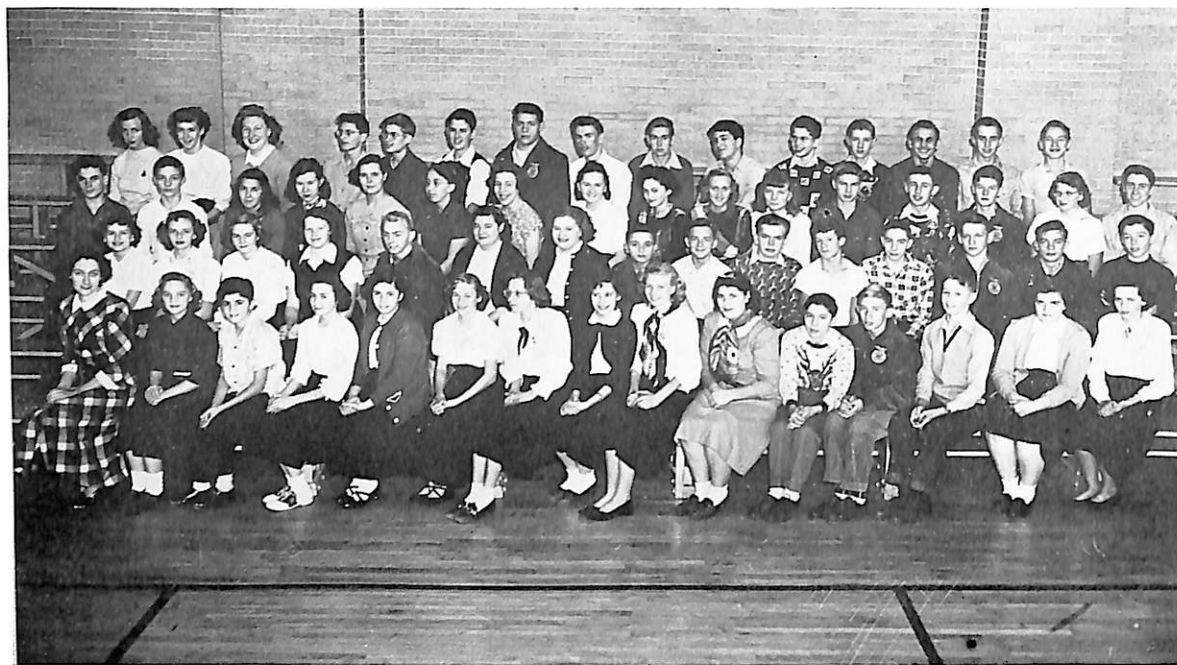
The sophomores are now anticipating the activities of our junior and senior years.

The Freshman Class is now eagerly looking forward to the activities of our sophomore year.



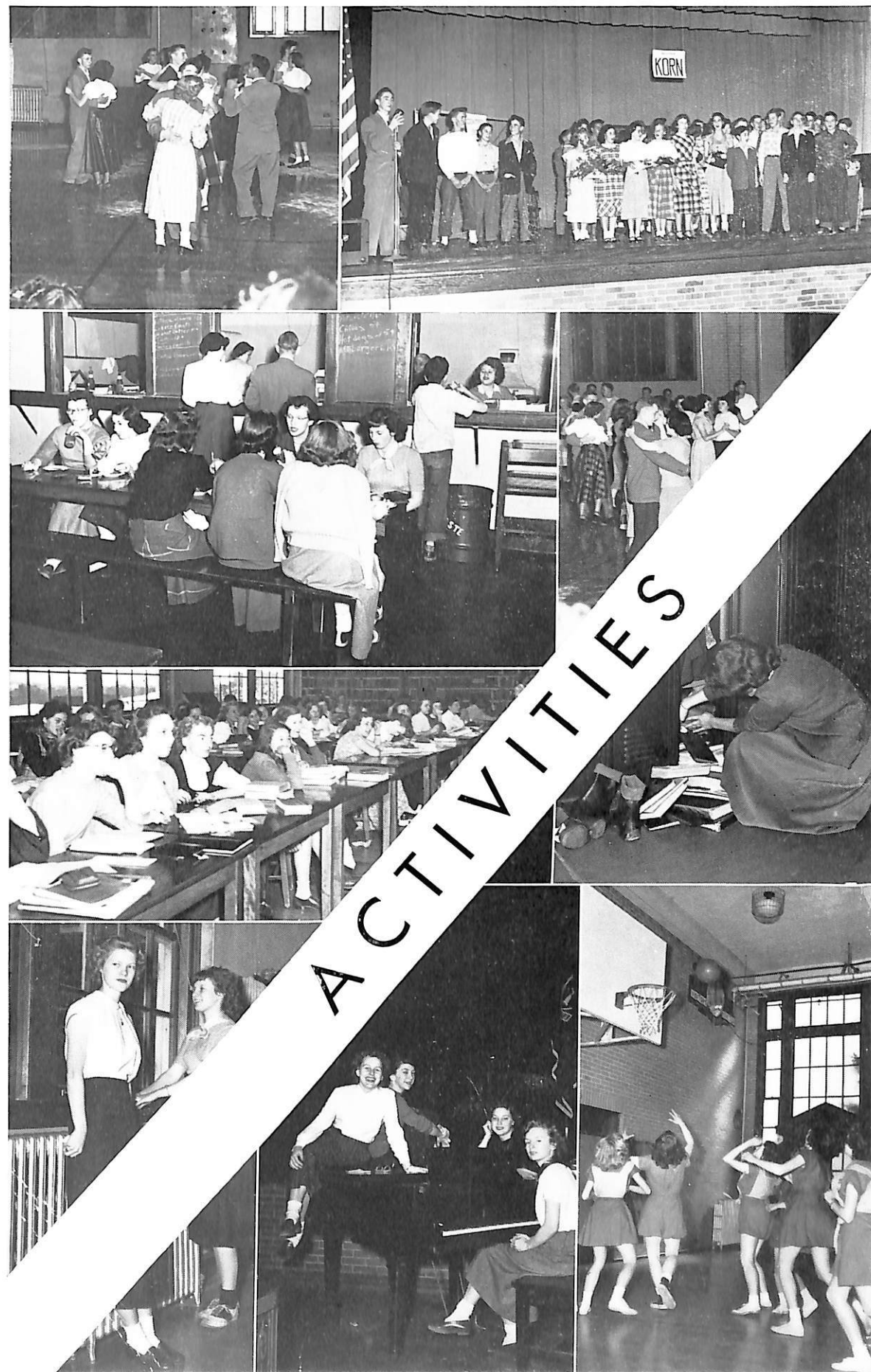

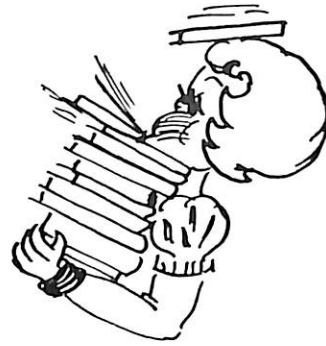

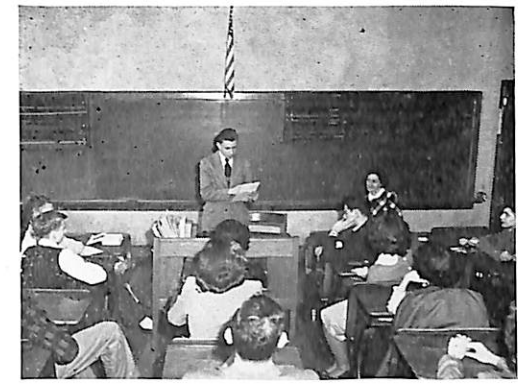

In November, ten members accompanied by Mr. Flood, attended the State Association of Student Councils at Princeton University. The trip was enjoyed by all who attended.

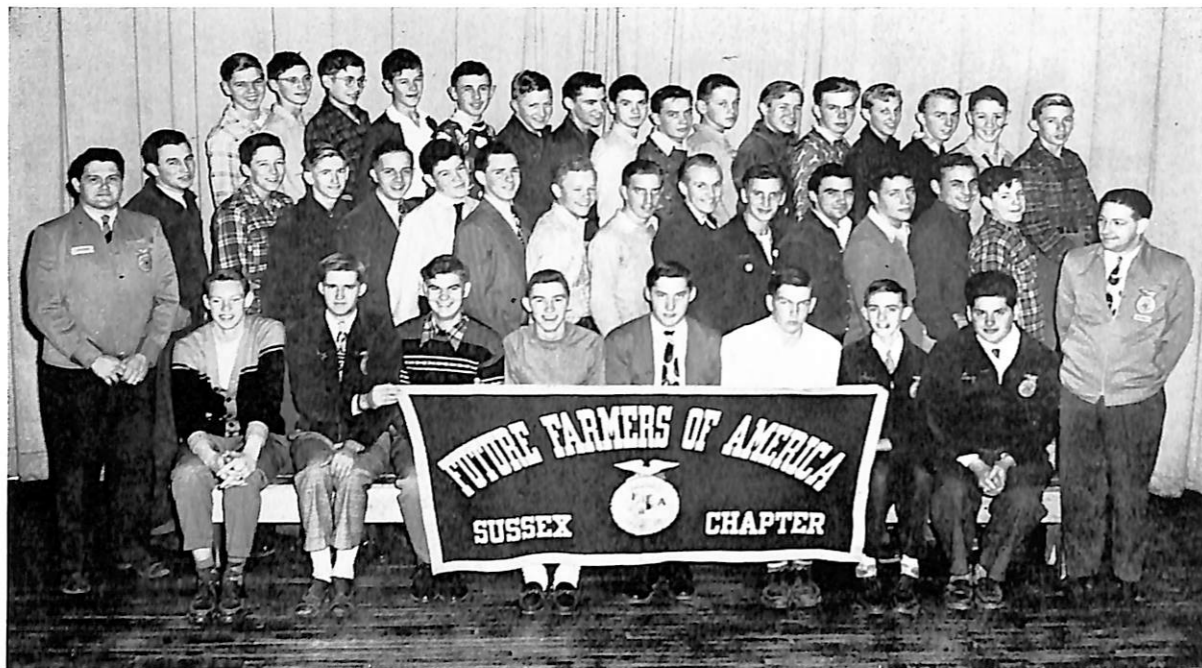

FUTURE FARMERS OF AMERICA

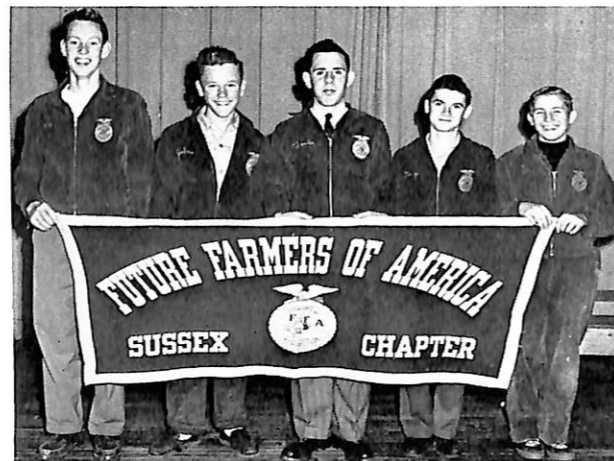

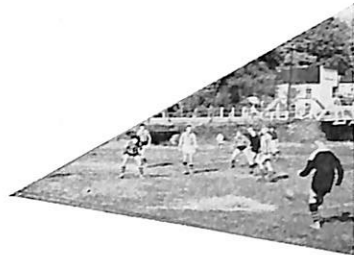

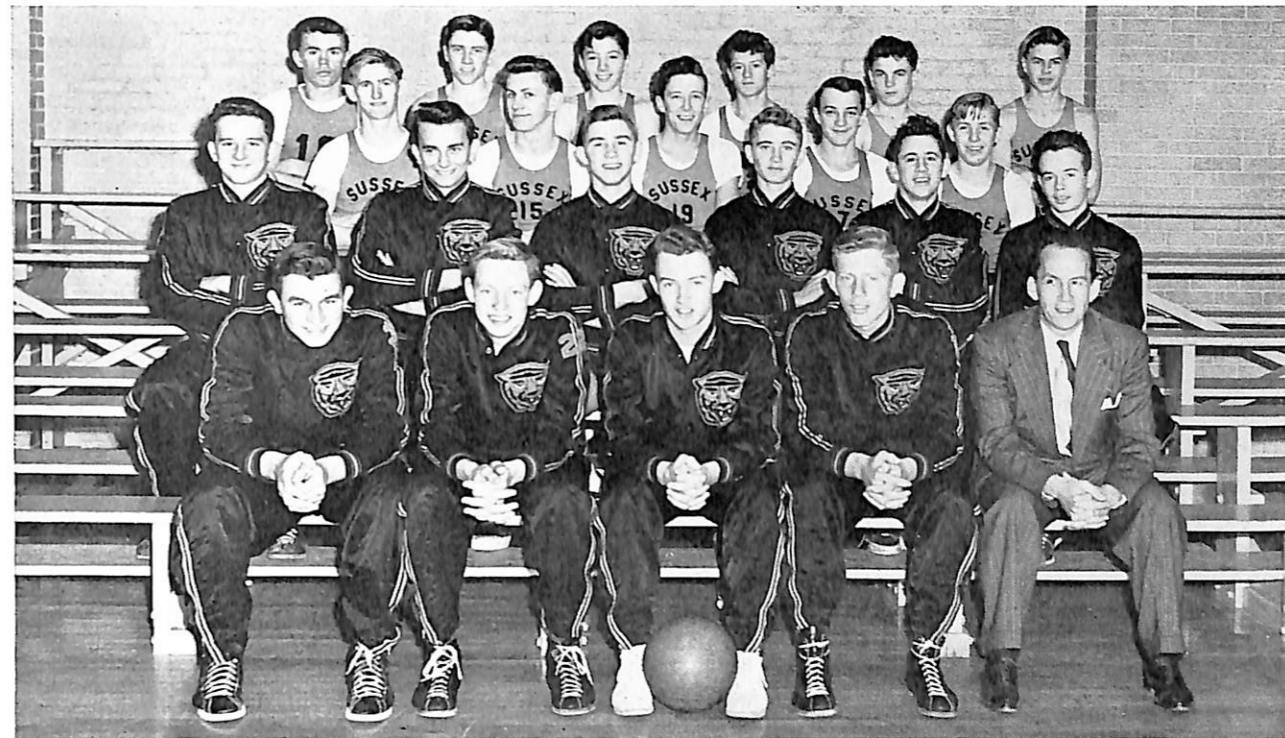
